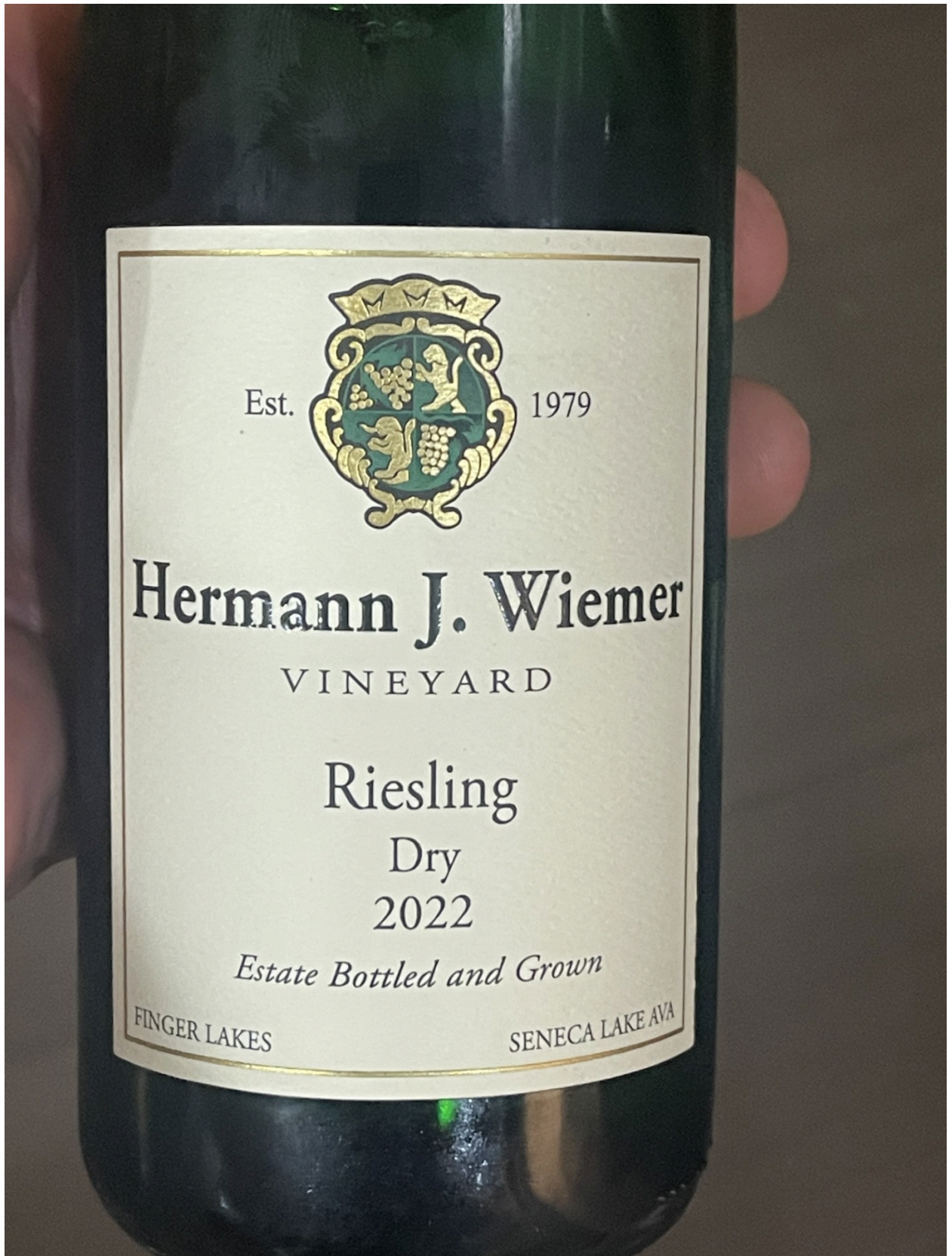

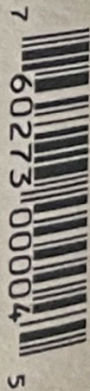

Palate: Lemon, green apple, pineapple, slight hint of petrol (not pronounced, but a slight hint of it).

Not as razor sharp acidic backbone as I like from riesling, but a very solid bottle of riesling, from the exciting region of the Finger Lakes. If you've never tried a Finger Lakes wine, this is a great place to start, as the wine is affordable and well made. Wiemer has been producing wine since 1979, and is one of the premier producers of the Finger Lakes. Insider tip, if you can find the 2017 vintage of this wine, it offers something more, as the 2017 vintage was a difficult vintage and Wiemer did not produce their single vineyard bottling of this wine, and instead used all of the fruit from single vineyard bottling and used for this bottling, so for that vintage you are getting

higher regarded single fruit in the 2017 vintage. This is the dry riesling bottling, so there will be less residual sugar in this bottling than some of their other riesling bottlings.
